## Heating Oil Theft

We are investigating a theft of heating oil which has been reported to us. It has occurred anytime between Saturday 2nd May 2026 and Thursday 7th May 2026, however we suspect the incident to have occurred during the early hours between 03:00hrs and 04:00hrs on the 2nd May. This is from a property in Manfield, Richmondshire.

Do you have any information which would assist North Yorkshire Police in finding those responsible and help keep your community safe?

### Advice to prevent oil theft

Plant shrubs or install fences to hide your tank from view, especially if you live near a road. If your tank is openly accessible, consider moving it to a more secluded area.

Check your tank's oil level on a regular basis.

Install security lighting that covers your tank and the surrounding area.

If you notice tankers or large vehicles close to your property - take down any details if you think they may be suspicious and report to the Police.

If your tank is located in an outbuilding, secure the building at all times.

Remove any empty containers or drums from the immediate area as they could draw attention to the presence of your oil tank.

Deter thieves from entering your property by installing security lighting, lockable gates and maintain boundaries and perimeter fences.

## Equipment and tool security

Equipment and tool security can be a particular issue for rural businesses and farms.

To keep your belongings safe:

Lock equipment away in a secure building or part of a building when not in use

Invest in a secure storage toolbox

Install a burglar alarm on buildings where equipment is kept

Always lock vehicles when left outside and keep the keys in your possession

Keep expensive items and vehicles out of sight when not in use

Consider using hitch locks, wheel clamps or ground anchors

Mark your tools and equipment and register them

Keep a record of all valuable items

Consider fitting outside security lights
